RESOLVED THAT the By Laws of the Town of Stellarton respecting "Closing of Shops" be amended as follows:

That Section 1 of the By Laws of the Town of Stellarton respecting the closing of Shops is hereby repealed and the following Section 1 Substituted therefore:

CLOSING OF SHOPS

1. No proprietor or manager of any shop, store or place where dry goods, gents' furnishings, clothing millinery, groceries, hardware or boots and shoes are exposed or offered for sale by retail in the Town of Stellarton shall allow any shop, store or place to be or remain open so as to serve customers during any of the times specified hereinafter throughout the year, Namely;-

Monday, Thursday and Saturday after five o'clock in the afternoon, on Tuesday after nine o'clock in the afternoon, on Friday after ten o'clock in the afternoon, and on Wednesday after one o'clock in the afternoon, and on the whole of every statutory holiday as defined by the "Interpretation Act", Chapter 1, Revised Statutes, 1923, and amendments thereto, PROVIDED however, that these By Laws shall not apply to any day immediately preceding a statutory holiday as aforesaid, or to the period of two weeks immediately preceding Christmas.

CLOSING OF SHOPS

1. No proprietor or manager of any shop, store or place where dry goods, gents' furnishings, clothing, millinery, meat, groceries, hardware or boots and shoes are exposed or offered for sale by retail in any town, shall allow any shop, store, or place to be or remain open so as to serve customers during any of the times specified hereinafter throughout the year, namely:-

Monday, Thursday and Friday after six o'clock in the afternoon, and Wednesday after 1 o'clock in the afternoon, and on the whole of every statutory holiday as defined by "The Interpretation Act," Chapter 1, Revised Statutes, 1923, PROVIDED, however, that these By-Laws shall not apply to any day immediately preceding a statutory holiday as aforesaid, or on Saturday, or to the period of two weeks immediately preceding Christmas Day.

2. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these By-Laws shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars, and in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding One Month.
