COST OF ADVERTISING
THE
NOTICE OF ZONING BY-LAW

1. Any zoning by-law for the Town of Stellarton proposed to be passed by the Town Council pursuant to Section 36 of Chapter 16 of the Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1969, or any zoning by-law to be amended, revised or repealed pursuant to Section 38 of said Act, shall be commenced in accordance with Section 36 (1) of said Act by giving notice of the intention of the Council to pass, amend, revise or repeal such zoning by-law by advertisement inserted at least once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper circulating in the area to be affected.
2. Any person who wishes to obtain the amendment or the repeal of a zoning by-law shall submit his application in writing to the clerk.
3. The applicant shall deposit with the Clerk an amount estimated by the Clerk to be sufficient to pay the cost of advertising as required by Section 38 of said the Town Planning Act.

4. After the advertising has been completed, the applicant shall pay to the Clerk any additional amount required to defray the cost of the advertising or, if there is a surplus, the Clerk shall refund the same to the applicant.
